Jim was a man who could get things done and his congregations loved him, but he never talked about himself or what he had done. Jim always lifted others up and sincerely celebrated their ministry. Jim's sincerity and humility encouraged several people to go into full-time ministry! Jim's ministry always pointed to God. That is how I heard God calling me into ministry. The day my father died, Jim came to our house within minutes. He picked up a vacuum and without saying a word began to vacuum the living room knowing people would soon be arriving. Jim also helped to clean up from my dad's hemorrhage. I saw Jim do things that only a Christian who was a true servant would do. My father, A. Francis Shaw was a quiet, strong man with a great deal of integrity. He lived out that one does the right thing no matter the cost. My ministry for the last thirty-four years has been shaped by these two great and humble men. Neither of them is alive today, but both are part of my great cloud of witnesses. Neither man took himself too seriously. Both loved to laugh, even at themself. Both men put others before themselves. All of us at times miss the mark of truly trying to serve in humility. If we really do what this passage tells us to do, we will truly become a great Church in the likeness of Christ. I want to live out humble service each day of 2023, want to join me?
