Kelly Carpenter becoming our pastor on January 1st, 2024.

Rev. Kelly P. Carpenter grew up in church parsonages, a "preacher's kid," from Indiana. He was ordained an Elder in the United Methodist Church in 1995. Kelly received a Bachelor of Arts with degrees in Religion, Philosophy & English Literature from the University of Indianapolis, 1988; in 1994, he received a Master of Divinity from Vanderbilt Divinity School. He has certifications from the Haden Institute as a Spiritual Director and Dream Leadership.

Kelly has lived in both Greensboro and Chicago. For 20 years, he served as Senior Pastor of Green Street United Methodist Church where he founded The Shalom Project, a local non profit whose mission is to disrupt the cycle of poverty for people. In 2021, Kelly began working in an extension ministry appointment as the Executive Director of Threshold Retreat, working toward the construction of a Retreat Center in East Bend, NC. The first project of this non profit was Threshold Farm, which has taken on the mission of providing organic fresh food for people facing food insecurity. In 2023, he returned to parish ministry at Baltimore church in East Bend, and in July as the Senior Pastor of the Anchor Cooperative Parish (churches: Shady Grove, Prospect, New Home, Mt. Pleasant) all in East Bend & Booneville.

Kelly has a love of writing/reading poetry, organic gardening, dreamwork, watching basketball, jazz and running. Kelly is married to Dr. Lyn Parkerson Carpenter, a clinical psychologist for children and their families. They have one daughter, Kate, a Senior at NC State University studying film and screenwriting. The Carpenters have lived in

the Ardmore neighborhood for 15 years.






