#### Dear Ardmore Family,

Seminary did not prepare me at all for what we have experienced over the past year. At Duke we studied things like How to Interpret the Scriptures, Doing Theology in a way that draws people nearer to God, Church History which helps us learn lessons for our past and guide our future, and Pastoral Care. What I am certain we did not have nor is there a class entitled: How to Lead in a Pandemic. You know what though? I think we have done quite well in spite of it all. I am thankful, as I hope you are, for such a wonderful church home and family at Ardmore!

The year 2020 has been a year to remember. Or perhaps one we would like to forget. Dealing with COVID-19 since March has forced us to live our lives differently in so many ways. It has also challenged us to find new ways to worship together, to stay in contact with each other virtually as well as through phone calls and visits all the while keeping six feet away from each other. Thankfully, our ministries have continued on during this time and we have been blessed to be able to provide worship and social interaction with your church via new and innovative platforms such as live-streaming, ZOOM, Dial-My-Calls and physical distancing.

Normally, about this time of the year, we would be planning for the annual "ask" for pledges for the next year so we can prepare the new budget. For 2021, we are expecting a relatively flat budget. I have been working with Milton Kern, our Chair of the Finance Committee, and we hope to provide the safest and simplest stewardship campaign we can. This year, our pledge campaign will be functioning differently as we continue to adapt to the changes we have experienced over the last number of months.

There will be no official pledge campaign for 2021. Rather, we are asking you to allow us to use the same pledge that you made in 2020 for 2021.

Unfortunately, but as you could probably suspect, giving has declined slightly during this year of COVID-19. To those of you who are able, we ask you to consider an increase to your pledge as we work with the complexities and uncertainties of coming back together for classes, events and worship as we did before. We also must continue caring for our facilities and taking good care of our incredible staff. Finally, the important missional needs are greater now than ever and we must be able to provide even more resources to our outreach partners. Of course, with the impact of COVID-19 we fully understand that some of you may have to reduce your pledge.

This year, in order to be better stewards and not to increase the covid-19 risk, we will be reaching out

There is a Season...

"To all, life thou givest, to both great and small; in all life thou livest, the true life of all; we blossom and flourish as leaves on the tree, and wither and perish, but naught changeth thee."

Every year on November 1st, the Church celebrates All Saints Day. The purpose of All Saints Day is to remember all the saints that have gone before us and remind us that we are a part of a "Great Cloud of Witnesses." Typically, local congregations mark the dav by remembering the saints their of own congregations; members who have left this earthly life and have passed on to the heavenly realm. At Ardmore UMC, we will be honoring the saints of our congregation who have passed on in the previous year by reading their names, lighting a candle, and tolling a bell.

In the midst of a global pandemic, there is a lot to mourn and grieve; families who have lost a loved one may not have had an opportunity to express their loss through traditional funerals or memorial services, others are mourning over the 200,000+ lives that have been lost in our nation because of COVID-19, and some are lamenting the heightened racial disparities in our nation and the unjust deaths of our colored brothers and sisters. No matter the reason, All Saints Day gives us an opportunity to reflect and mourn these losses.

In addition, All Saints Day reminds us of our own mortality and the fragility of human life. Each

year, we experience the beauty of the seasons in creation. Similarly, our very lives experience seasons: birth, childhood, youth, adulthood, elderly, and death. We are reminded in Genesis that God breathes the breath of life into dust and creates humanity. From dust we are created, and to dust we will eventually turn. Many of us may be uncomfortable with the inevitable nature of death, however death is never the final season. As spring brings rebirth and new life out of winter, likewise out of death comes a resurrection.

I am often reminded about the seasonal nature of our lives in creation and music. There are many hymns that reference death and resurrection, however I am always drawn to the 17th century Hymn, "Immortal, Invisible, God Only Wise", by Scotsman Walter Chalmers Smith. Although the crux of this hymn focuses on the almighty and immortal nature of God, it does reference that all of God's creation, including humanity, faces seasons of growth and decay. However, even in the midst of all this change, God remains constant and God's love for all of us stays with us no matter what season we find ourselves in.

This All Saints Day, let us remember the saints of our lives, past and present. Let us also be reminded that the same God who worked through them is working through us now. May we embrace each different season of our lives, not knowing exactly where we go, but being assured that we rest in the almighty, unchanging hands of God, whose love has no bounds.
