

ardmore ERT In Mission To Others








Ardmore has had a heart for missions for most of her life, but a 21st century addition was the ERT team. Building team trips to Pocahontas, Va., Guatemala, and Mississippi led to the dream of an Early Response Team on the part of John Corum and others. An Eagle Scout project by Chanse Myers led to the outfitting of an ERT trailer, which has responded in eastern NC and Kentucky and to Spruce Pine, NC in 2024 and January 2025. With our four "muddy buddies" from Albemarle, five Ardmore members worked on the home of a young family in Bakersville, NC. Maggie and Ruben and their four children, along with a cousin's family, watched the waters of Helene rise to the windows of their double-wide and sweep away their chickens and trout. Though their home exhibited mold, a strong love of family, with their children's handprints and names painted on the walls of their bedrooms with the date they moved into their first home. Maggie's hardscrabble mountain upbringing and resilience (along with her deep love and faith) have enabled her to overcome many challenges, including serious health crises, and continue working to make their lives better.

Maggie, Ruben and their older son worked alongside us to tear out the flooring and moldy insulation and prepare the house for a partner Baptist building team which will begin work in mid-January on putting in new flooring. Samaritan's Purse (which along with Islamic Disaster Response is also partnering with the Methodists) provided a new vehicle to replace their cars which were swept away, and two new campers to get through the winter in place of the used one with a hole in the roof and mold inside which someone had donated. In the afternoon, their girls made cookies for the Christ UMC group tearing out insulation under the house, and our group went on to Valle Crucis UMC to do another Shockwave (mold remediation) treatment on their building. Our trip was cut short by the snowstorm, but the gratitude expressed by Maggie and Ruben and the sense of accomplishment left us eager to return in the future to help others. Before we left on Thursday night, the members of Spruce Pine UMC fed us a home-cooked meal in their Fellowship Hall/Beacon Center, where they provide a temporary place to sleep, water and fuel for those needing a place to get warm. This small congregation has a huge heart!

All who are interested in being trained and joining the Ardmore Early Response Teams are encouraged to contact the church office and a Early Response Team member will be in touch with the next steps.

Would you like to help, but can't travel to Western NC to wield a crowbar, swing a hammer or install drywall? The head of the Spruce Pine cooks expressed a desire for other Ardmore members to send casseroles along to serve the volunteers staying at the church when we return! CUTTING BACK ON PLASTIC USE IS TAKING CARE OF CREATION

Fifty years ago, we went from very little plastic in our grocery stores (and almost no single-use disposable plastic products) to more than 300 million tons of plastic items each year - everything from bottled water to food coverings, most of which gets tossed. Even though you may see a recycling logo on the bottom of your plastic products, less than 8% actually gets recycled and the rest gets buried, burned or ends up in our oceans. This proliferation of plastic is endangering all forms of life.

The Ardmore UMC Creation Care team would like to encourage everyone to do what they can to reduce their plastic usage and waste as a way of protecting and preserving God's gift of our incredible Creation, in our role as stewards.
